Activity

- You mayuseyouroperativearmasmuchasyourpain allows you to use it
- Usearmslinguntilyou'recomfortablewithoutit
- It'sokaytobatheorshowerasyounormallywould. Yourdressing is waterproof.

Diet

- Clearliquidsuntilnonauseaorvomiting
- Advancetoregulardietastolerated.
- Ifnauseaandvomitingoccurs,usethePhenerganprescriptionyou were given by Dr. Kerns.If the Phenergandoesnotworkpleasecallourdoctoroncall

Pain

- Expect to have a moderate amount of pain.
- Takepainmedicationasdirected by the prescription you were given.
- Remember that it often helps to take acetaminophen with your pain medication if your medication does not already contain acetaminophen. You may take up to six extra strength Tylenol or up to nine regular Tylenol per 24 hours if your medication DOES NOT already contain acetaminophen.
- You may also use Ibuprofen 800 mg every six hours or Aleve 440 mg every eight hours in addition to your prescribed pain medicine.

Dressing Care

• There is no need to change your dressing before your follow up visit, but you may remove in four days if you would like it off.

Call your doctor if

- Excessive bleeding that does not stop after holding mom pressure over the area
- Temperature of 100.5 degrees F or greater
- Redness, excessive swelling or bruising, and/or green or yellow, smelly discharge from incision.
- Any color, temperature, or sensation changes in operative arm/hand

Anesthesia

- For the next 24 hours do not drive, drink alcoholic beverages, or make important decisions
- Plan to stay tonight within one hours drive from the hospital
- Be aware of dizziness following anesthesia and while taking pain medications
- Use the incentive spirometer every hour when awake until 24 hours after your surgery.

Medications

• Continue home medications as previously prescribed, unless told otherwise
